He received his doctor of medicine and doctor of philosophy in immunology from the University Of Pennsylvania School Of Medicine in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Following training in internal medicine, he completed a post-doctoral fellowship at the Whitehead Institute for Biomedical Research in Cambridge, Massachusetts. In 2009 he received the William Dameshek Prize for outstanding contribution in hematology from the American Society of Hematology and in 2010 he received an NIH Director's Award for his work with the Lymphoma Leukemia Molecular Profiling Project. Dr. Staudt serves on the editorial boards of *Genome Biology* and *Cancer Cell* and is associate editor of the *Journal of Experimental Medicine*. His research is focused on the study of the molecular basis of human lymphoid malignancies.
